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

SUPERA

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The year 2022 was one of the most successful but also the most difficult for us. As an organization, we have grown significantly and now we have twice as many children in the program as in the previous year. The record registration is also a result of expansion of Superar in a new location, but mainly an expression of children's desire for social contact and new experiences after the end of the pandemic measures. We saw it in their spontaneous reactions when we started singing live again:

Despite many positive things we achieved, the year 2022 was difficult. War in Ukraine affected everyone.

Ukrainian children joined our student collectives. Many of them were direct witnesses of the fury of war. We believe it is our task to help these families find safety in Slovakia, experience acceptance

and forget, at least for a while, what is happening in their families and cities back home in Ukraine. 2022 showed us that our long-term action brings results in relation to children, schools and communities. It works.

Preface

We see that the schools where we have been working for a long time are gradually changing successfully.

After the easing of pandemic measures, children applied en masse. We have expanded to a new location

in Veľky Krtíš and we have more than 550 children participating in our intensive program. We are also launching our program in kindergartens, we have expanded the team and are negotiating new collaborations. We have published the first collection of music education methodologies and we made professional videos to go with it.

We began to systematically collect data, monitor and analyze the impact of our activities qualitatively as well as quantitatively. We are part of a team that, in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Research, Development and Youth of the Slovak Republic, is working on reforming the content of education as part of the Recovery Plan. Our aim is to fundamentally change the content





PRINCIPLES

1 Excellence

Our music education supports concentration, motivation, communication skills, creativity, self-confidence, discipline and responsibility. We want children to perform at their best and be proud of themselves.

2 Identity and diversity

We find beauty in diversity. Each child can present their own abilities without fear and find their place among others.

3 Social cohesion

Regular work and successful performances, audience appreciation, joy of music, new friendships – all this unites different groups of children and gives them a new common identity.

4 Cultural exchange

We also open the door to the most famous music stages in Europe for children from disadvantaged backgrounds. The collective feeling of success from performances is a great source of motivation for children.

- 5 We are not exclusive, we are inclusive We are not looking for great musical talents, but we are awakening the potential and creativity hidden in every child.
- 6 Learning with joy

Musical and artistic creation is connected with a strong emotional experience. Joy that is brought by the results of their own efforts motivates children to constantly improve.

7 Inclusion

Thanks to our program children from socially excluded communities are in long-term collaboration with children from the majority. We know from experience that this really enriches the children on both sides.

8 Availability

Children who participate in education within Superar Slovakia do not pay for this program or any related activity.

We perform with children directly at schools, in wider communities, but also at important domestic and international festivals or on the stages of cultural institutions. We enable children to work in a varied team and be in touch with diversity thanks to interaction across classes, schools and internationally within the Superar network and beyond. Thanks to Superar children experience the joy of self-realization and the feeling of success, thereby building awareness of personal value and identity. We educate for creativity, personal involvement, we strive for character education for life. We encourage a shift from memorization to understanding relationships and connections. We connect education with real life.

"In addition to the fact that in the end 90 teachers and parents who do not have children in Superar came to the concert in Slovak Philharmonic (this was a big deal, it also cost a lot of time and money), after the concert my colleagues stopped me in the corridors saying that it was a great experience for them and that they had no idea that we have such a beautiful concert hall in Bratislava. And that only after years of hearing about Superar did they understand what the program was about and that it must take a lot of effort and work to develop something like that. So teachers of mathematics and Slovak don't look at me disdainfully anymore with the notion that I rest at work and they have to work much more. I didn't expect such a twist - I was worried that it was a silly idea to convince them to buy tickets, that it would turn out all wrong :-)"


We dedicated our 2022 annual concert to all the children who have become part of our schools and lives during the last 2 months. The concert in the beautiful Moyzes Hall of the Faculty of Arts at the Comenius University was extraordinary.

More than 100 children performed accompanied by professional musicians and in front of a full hall of parents and friends of Superar.

> There was also the world premiere of a new adaptation of the well-known cycle *Cooking Porridge* by by Slovak composer Eugen Suchoň. With the kind permission of the

maestro's daughter and son-in-law - Danica and Peter Štilicha - this arrangement was created by Peter Zagar. We initiated it as part of the Songs for Europe project, which Superar has been part of for 2 years. Peter Zagar arranged the cycle for the chamber orchestra or school orchestras - children all over the world can play it! At the concert, the last 3 parts were performed by our children from ((S)) Detva and ((S)) Lozorno, accompanied by the Moyzes Quartet, Peter Zagar (piano) and our guest brass section.

A big surprise was an unusual trio of percussionists – Tomáš Boroš, Ivan Šiller and Hana Machajdíková.



We also influence society through our performances at leading cultural institutions and music festivals.


We have published the first collection of musiceducational activities Months & Numbers by Tomáš Boroš. We managed to shoot professional videos for the methodologies even during the covid pandemic, with daily testing of all participants. Both the children and the teachers did a great job! The children were focused, patient and a pleasure to work with. The filming was done with children from Alexander Vagač Primary School and Kindergarten in Detva and children from Lozorno Primary School with a crew consisting of Braňo Gotthardt and Kika Majorošová. Our teachers devoted hours and hours of time and tons of energy to preparation with the children: Olga Bystrianska, Zdenka Fekiačová Skruteková, Eva Šušková and Lenka Brádňanská. The collections are based on the musicpedagogical concepts of C. Orff and Z. Kodály. They aim at elementary musical creation (improvisation and composition). The names of months of the year and the numbers from one to twenty form the material for rhythming, movement, intonation and understanding of how musical structure works.

> Individual activities in the synthesis of the speech-movement-music triad develop musical abilities, especially auditory-perceptual, rhythmic, intonation, auditory-motor skills, as well as musical memory and imagination.

The methodological material is suitable for choirmasters of children's choirs as well as for teachers of music education in primary and secondary schools (music education, music teaching, singing; it can also be adapted to certain aspects of instrumental playing). Additionally, working with parts of speech enables various cross-subject relationships (English language, Slovak language, Mathematics, Science

3 Supervision and courses

Our teachers completed regular supervisions with Ivan Šiller and recorded their activities in weekly and monthly reports. On a weekly basis, they devoted themselves to monitoring, which included qualitative and quantitative parameters and reflection of pedagogical activity. Throughout the year teachers met at special pedagogical meetings where they discussed current problems and challenges in the classrooms, they prepared repertoire and shared their experiences and needs.

As a teacher, she works for the Private Conservatory of Nitra, and her other place of work is the Helena Madariova Private Elementary Art School in Nitra where she teaches 4-5 year old children. In addition to our teaching staff, teachers from kindergartens, primary art schools and alternative schools using the Waldorf method also came.


